Linking fragmented fresh water swamps through restoration of micro-corridors: Workshops, exposure visits and training camps

To create interest and awareness in students about special ecosystem Myristica swamps, Snehakunja and LIFE trust has organised eco development camp to the science graduate students. The students were from the botany and zoology disciplines. By visiting Myristica swamp forests, the students were informed about the importance of this fragile patch of forests and its conservation need. Further the students got information about unique features of some swamp species, the ecological service of these plants, and the special characters that are needed to sustain these ecosystem. Various activities like quiz competitions, drawings sketches on swamp ecosystem, group discussions, about swamp forests and its importance were conducted with the students. Quiz competitions based on swamp forests and its vegetations was held with the students.





Field visits to various swamps and discussions at different levels with Forest Department officials, involving them in organizing the workshops/meetings, visits to nursery area were done to involve the major stakeholders in the project activity. Various stakeholders like Agriculturists, Horticulturists, Marginal farmers, Landless labours, Artisans, NTFP collectors, outside resource users, Traditional Herbal Healers, Myristica swamp Conservation Committee, Youth club, Women groups, Village Forest Committee, State Forest Department, Minor irrigation/Watershed Department and other line departments, Administration units from Village Panchayat to Zilla Panchayat, local watershed management committee are involved at various stages of the project activity. Meeting was held with Chairman Western Ghats Task Force Karnataka State Government, Chief Secretary of Uttara Kannada district, executive officers of Taluk Panchayat and with development officers at Village Panchayat level. Project activities were also briefed to district minister. Project activities and results were presented during seminars in which senior forest officials, forest minister have participated.

People participation and role of community in conservation and management of forest and swamps to ensure biodiversity protection and ecosystem services rendered by the swamp forests was discussed during the workshops.

- Preventing the encroachment that was leading to land use change of the swamp forests
- Preventing illegal felling and sustainable water usage
- Preventing the poaching of wild animals
- Empowering the local people in value addition and marketing of agriculture and Non Timber Forest Products, and in effective management of the swamps and adjacent forests.

Further, during these workshops we elaborated about what is fresh water swamp? What are the methods for ecological restoration? How to make the entire restoration work participatory? Project activities and out comes to date were explained to the participants using visual media. Under changing ecological, socio-cultural aspects, conservation methods should adopt holistic landscape approach instead of individual species based approach. Demonstration was done on grafting techniques, nursery rising, management techniques and other agronomical aspects on priority species of Non Timber Forest Product to the local residents especially women. Trekking to swamps with media people, senior forest department officials, VFC members and local villagers was held to create awareness on swamps and to disseminate the project results to general public.
